## 1. Your provider fails to give you the proactive assistance you require.




An excellent holistic monitoring system should be able to recognize and address issues before they arise.

Quick changes in response to market conditions, consumer behavior, or other variables are more complex.


## 3. Your IT team cannot modify or control your site's environment.

A good provider will invest in systems that permit shared access, enabling merchants to develop fixes for problems while maintaining the functionality of your system. If your IT team cannot resolve the issue independently, they may need to escalate the problem to a higher-level support team or vendor support if necessary.



## 4. Your hosting company is unfamiliar with complex environments like Oracle ATG.
